The Economics Department comprising of Sir Lohrü, Miss Jennifer, Miss Vikhono had a departmental meeting on the  $4^{\rm th}$  of April in the college. All concerned were present.

- A prepared structure was presented/formulated by the HOD regarding the CBCS course which will make it easy on the department.
- Although it may seem that two papers are running the same course namely the Introduction
  to Macroeconomics and Principles of Macroeconomics, it could be that one falls for the
  General students and the other for the Honours students as one of the course have denser
  content. Hence those two papers may have two separate classes.
- For the Economics Honours students, there are no compulsory English papers whereas General students have to take them.
- For interdisciplinary courses, we can contemplate on online courses to allow them to take from other colleges/streams even if it might not be put in immediate action the plan for students to hop from college to college for the course that they are interested which may not be offered in the college.
- Since International Economics, Public Finance, Financial Institutions and Markets etc. are courses we already offer, we can continue taking them for the CBCS course.
- To make available to the students the Dissertation/Project option like the previous syllabus was suggested
- Making of the routine might look complex but if each department make their own
  independent routines keeping the students in mind, it falls on the student to adjust their
  preferences accordingly.
- A suggestion where Add-On courses can be taken during the library/mentoring when needed was put forward.
- Discussion on how other institutions from Nagaland as well as outside conduct their UG programs like collecting credit points were had.
- Miscellaneous issues were discussed among the teachers on the Core Courses, DSC and DSE,
   GE. AECC. SEC of the CBCS system such as
  - EVS and Communication English coming under the AECC course.
  - What papers could be offered by the college under the SEC paper.
  - An Economics Honours students can go and take a subject which is not discipline specific for his GE courses.
  - ❖ Four classes for Honours students in the beginning, then 5 classes for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, then going back to 4 classes for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year= 26 papers in total. Although especially the 2 classes concerning the AECC course in the 1st year will be outside our domain.
  - General students having more variety of classes than the Honours students, perhaps to give them a wider scope and general knowledge for such exams like competitive exams etc. meanwhile the Honours students are maybe groomed for Academics.
  - A more clearer picture about the Honours paper than the General papers. Papers offered for DSE, DSC and such yet to be decided.

He addressed the room on the benefits of having these departmental meetings where one can reflect and be updated.
- The HOD of the Economics Dept., Sir Kohli Lohrü, started off by saying that each teacher has the same amount of paper and therefore share the same burden. 3 papers each.
- The HOD takes the class 12 and 2 UG classes: 1Honourspaper and 1General paper.
   Ms. Jennifer Veyie takes 3 UG classes: 1Honourspaper and 2 General paper.
   Ms. VikhonoMeyase takes the class 11 students and 2 UG papers: 2 Honours paper.
- Discussions on the irregularity of the class 11 and 12 students were had with a few exceptions. A suggestion on pre-ponding the class timings from 9:45 to 9:00 was made to make them have a sense of seriousness and urgency to attend classes aligning with higher secondary school timings.
- Though it may seem otherwise, exceptional students can be found in +2 classes deserving of 1<sup>st</sup> Divisions.
- Screening of Class 11 students in the next annual year.
- Must retain our own students for the UG program.
- Generally speaking, unlike the Class 11 and 12, the students in the UG program are not bad.
- Comparatively lesser students, so greater opportunities for having one on one interactions and learning experiences and greater chances of discovering the student's personalities and working on them.
- Engaging the students with different modes of learning through activities as well, like chart
  making, presentations, case studies, field trips, providing documentaries etc. and enhancing
  their learning.
- Advertising the papers offered in the college like Industrial Economics which are not offered anywhere else.
- With the impending induction of the CBCS systems, options on the maths portion of Economics could be considered.
- Stress on the importance of revisions for students even after the syllabus are covered.
- Discussions on the making of routine anddoing it correctly which will add to the smooth functioning of the college.
- The choices offered in the CBCS may be applicable for large colleges but not small colleges, logistic difficulties of travelling from one college toother colleges by students for want of a

paper offered by another in regard to say time, and traffic jams not to say about other factors.

- One of the orientation program offered by NU falling on the Alder Fest and the difficulty in rescheduling it because of the directive from the University.
- Some of the policies to be implemented are good ideas but not practical such as every
  college being autonomous and not affiliated, grouping of colleges under one umbrella so
  that each college could have 4000 to 5000 students.
- Mentors of the mentee should supervise and inform the parents/ guardians on the attendance of their ward and children.

The discussions were had, inputs were given and received well to be contemplated on and the meeting ended on a good note.


