#### OVERVIEW:



The questionnaires were sent out to the students using social media platforms, and notices were given regarding the closing dates. The feedback was then collected and analysed.

As many as 48 responses were received, and to arrive at comprehensive results, a simple statistical technique in percentile form was used. The details of the analysis are as follows:


# **Students Feedback**



1. Students profile : A total of 48 responses were collected, out of which 62.5% were male and 37.5% were female.


 Syllabus and Course Curriculum : on average 12.5% strongly agree that the syllabus and course curriculum is well – organized and structured and 81.3% agree that the syllabus and course curriculum is well organized and structured. However, 6.2% of the students think that the syllabus and course curriculum are not well-organized and structured.

The curriculum is well-organized and structured. 48 responses






5. On average 18.8% strongly agree while 75% agree that the students can apply the academic knowledge gained at college to real world situations. However, 6.2% of the students disagree.






7. On average 12.5% strongly agree while 68.8% agree that the internal review process is impartial. However, 16.7% disagree while 2% strongly disagree.




8. On average 12.5% strongly agree while 64.6% agree that teachers recognize their strengths and challenge them appropriately. However, 22.9% of the students disagree.



# CONCLUSION

Based on the student survey on the syllabus and its transaction conducted in the college for the academic year 2021 to 2022, feedback suggests that 94% on average are in agreement that the syllabus and course curriculum is well-organized and structured. In general, the sentiment of the students reflect satisfactory learning experience with 92% in agreement with the curriculum as equipping students with skills they need to succeed. Majority agree that teachers recognise their strengths and challenge them appropriately. However, there are some aspects that have the potential for improvement, such as encouragement for effective use of the suggestion box and opening up the lab for students' use among other suggestions.



#### 19 responses



Aims and objectives of the syllabi are well defined and clear to teachers and students. 19 responses




2. On average 78.9% agree that the syllabus is contemporary and need based. However, 21.1% are not sure.

Syllabus is contemporary and need based. 19 responses




3. 10.5% strongly agree while 84.2% agree that the pre-requisite courses are appropriate for this course. However, 5.3% are not sure.

4. On average 73.7% agree that the students attains the Pos, Cos and PSOs satisfactorily. However, 26.3% are not sure.





7. On average 5.3% strongly agree while 84.2% agree that the optional papers offered for the courses are adequate. However, 10.5% are not sure.





#### 46 responses



The curriculum is well organized and structured. 46 responses




2. Almost 32.6% extremely agree while 67.4% agree that the course/syllabus is able to increase their knowledge and understanding of the subjects studied during their term in college.

The course/syllabus is able to increase my knowledge and understanding of the subjects I studied during my term in college. 46 responses




2. On average 32.6% extremely agree while 56.5% agree that the teachers provided guidance and counseling in academic and non-academic matters. However 10.9% disagree.

The teachers provided guidance and counseling in academic and non-academic matters. 46 responses




3. On average 13% extremely agree while 58.7% agree that infrastructure necessary for teaching and learning were adequately available. However 28.3% disagree.

Infrastructure necessary for teaching and learning were adequately available. 46 responses




4. On average 23.9% extremely agree while 60.9% agree that the curriculum gives adequate balance between studies and social life. However, 15.2% disagree.



The curriculum gives adequate balance between studies and social life. 46 responses



The curriculum is useful from my job /present academic perspective. 46 responses





The syllabus motivated me for further studies. 46 responses





# CONCLUSION

Based on the alumni survey on the syllabus and its transaction for the academic year, the feedback suggests that 94% are satisfied with the structure of the curriculum. All respondents agree to the syllabus as having helped them increase their knowledge and understanding of the subject matter. Majority agree that guidance and counseling were provided and that the curriculum grants adequacy in the balance of studies and social life. The curriculum is useful from the perspective of the present placement. However, there is scope for improvement in areas such as academic and co-curricular activities, provision for Wi-Fi connection, modification of the syllabi and addition of skill development programmes.
